


Year 5 Summer Term Knowledge Organiser



Form can create an illusion of three-dimensional (3D) art using line and pattern.



Bridget Riley is an **Op. Artist** who uses lines and shapes to form **illusions**.



Op art is a form of abstract art that gives the illusion of movement by the precise use of pattern and colour.



A pattern uses a printed repeated **motif**.



One-point perspective art is a drawing method that shows how things appear to get smaller as they get further away towards a **vanishing point**.



Mood in art is a general **atmosphere** or feeling created by a piece of art using lines and colours.



A **realistic** painting looks like what it is representing.



An **abstract** painting represents an object, thing or experience using shapes, lines and colours.




Beethoven and Hans Zimmer are both **classical composers** from different eras.



David Brewster invented the kaleidoscope to understand how **optics** functioned.

form	The visible shape of something.
Op artist	An artist that uses optical illusions in their art work.
illusion	An instance of a wrong or misinterpreted perception.
Op art	Op art, short for optical art, is a style of visual art that uses optical illusions.
motif	A decorative image or design, especially a repeated one forming a pattern.
vanishing point	A vanishing point is a point on the horizon line where parallel lines meet. It is used in perspective rendering to create realistic depth and perspective in two-dimensional artwork.
atmosphere	The tone or mood of a place, situation, or creative work.
realistic	Representing things in a way that is true to how they appear in real life (life-like)
abstract	Relating to art that does not attempt to represent external reality.
classical composer	A person who writes music between 1750 and 1830.
optics	The scientific study of sight and the behaviour of light.
