

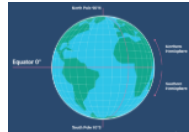
Year 2 Autumn Term Knowledge Organiser

Christopher Columbus is remembered because his voyages helped us understand our world.



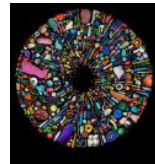
There are seven continents. The UK is in Europe.



There are five oceans: Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Southern and Arctic.



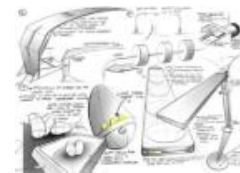
Sculptures (3D art) can be made from different materials joined together, like slip with clay.

Year 2 Autumn Term Key Vocabulary

ocean	A large area of salt water.
sea	A large area of salt water that is smaller than an ocean and partly or fully surrounded by land.
port	A place by water where ships and boats are loaded and unloaded. People can get on and off boats here too.
harbour	A safe place by the water where boats and ships can stay.
beach	A sandy or pebbly place where land meets water.
cliff	A high area of rock with a very steep side, often on a coast.
equator	An imaginary line that goes around the middle of the Earth, like a belt. It splits the Earth into two halves.
hemispheres	Half of the Earth, above or below the equator.
voyages	A long journey, especially by ship.
continents	A very large area of land made up of several countries.
3D	Having or appearing to have three dimensions (length, width and height).
slip	Potters use slip to decorate or glue pieces of clay together when they are making pottery.
artwork	Something creative a person makes to show ideas, feelings or tell a story.
pollution	Damage caused to water, air and other things by harmful substances or waste.
Likert scale	A rating scale to measure opinions, attitudes or behaviours.
design	To make or draw plans for something, for example clothes or buildings.
purpose	Why you do something or why something exists.
sewing	The skill or activity of making or repairing clothes or other things made from cloth.
running stitch	A simple type of sewing stitch.
