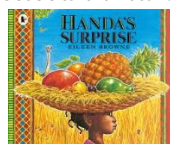


Home Learning Menu

Autumn – Where do we belong?



We would love for you to engage with our enquiry at home. In the table below there are lots of optional activities to pick and choose from this term. Once you have completed an activity, please upload it using a photo/video on your Class Dojo portfolio. Your home learning will be rewarded with Dojo points as well!

Can you draw a picture of yourself and try to describe yourself to a member of your family, e.g. I have brown hair and blue eyes. 	What would you like for your birthday? Tell an adult how old you are and how old you will be next. Write a list in your own writing of what presents you would like for your birthday.	Cook a cake or buns to celebrate a birthday tea party with your family or toys. 	Use google maps to find your house. Where do you live? What does your house look like? 
Draw or paint a picture of your house. What colour is your door? How many windows have you got? 	Who is in your family? Tell an adult or draw a picture of your family? 	Look at shapes around your house. Can you spot something that is a circle, triangle, rectangle and square, e.g. circle – clock. 	Tell an adult what rooms are in your house; bathroom, bedroom, kitchen, front room etc. Can you say what furniture is in each room? If you have a dolls house try and put the right furniture in the room
Video yourself re-telling the story of the 'Handa's Surprise' using the actions that we have practiced in nursery. 	Can you build a house? Using junk box modelling, duplo, lego, wooden blocks etc can you make your own house? 	Take a walk around Sutton-In-Ashfield! What can you see: Kingsmill reservoir, Saint Mary's church, Llamas Leisure Centre, McDonalds? Tell a grown up what you have seen? Can you draw them?	Using an atlas, globe or google maps can you find Canada? Can you find some key facts about Canada? 
What makes you happy? Complete an activity of your choosing that makes you happy! Why does it make you feel happy? 	Tell a grown-up something kind to make them smile – maybe even send them a card to cheer them up. Remember saying one kind word a day is so important!!!!	Dress up in clothes that you would wear in Canada? Remember it is colder in Canada than in England! 	Sing your favourite nursery rhyme. Maybe you could even dance to your favourite rhyme too!!!
